

Dr. Clemens Mader graduated in Environmental System Sciences and finished his PhD with an emphasis on Innovation and Sustainability Science as well as Regional Sciences at University of Graz, Austria. He has a main research and teaching emphasis in the fields of sustainability process assessment, transdisciplinary research as well as theories and practices of ESD. In 2002 he founded oikos Graz, the Student Organisation for Sustainable Economics and Management. After studies he spent a year in Switzerland to work as president of oikos International as well as at the ETH Zurich sustainability Center. At University of Graz he established the Regional Centre of Expertise on Education for Sustainable Development Graz-Styria (RCE Graz-Styria) which was acknowledged by the United Nations University in 2007. As director of the RCE he is coordinating regional and international research and development projects on ESD and sustainable regional development. Further, Clemens was visiting lecturer at Hiroshima University in Japan and University of Novi Sad, Serbia. Since January 2012 he's elected vice-president of the COPERNICUS Alliance – the European Higher Education Network for Sustainable Development. From May 2012 he's designated Visiting Professor for the Environment and Sustainability in the Region at Leuphana University in Lüneburg, Germany.
