Registration is open! CA Conference 2017: Hamburg Sustainable Development Summit, 26th-29th September

The CA Conference 2017 will be hosted as part of the <u>Hamburg Sustainable Development Summit 2017</u>, **26th-29th September** by CA member, the University of Hamburg. The event will focus on aspects of sustainable development at Higher Education Institutions, and in particular, contribution to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) within education, research, governance, operation and outreach initiatives.



Key topics to be addressed:

- Contribution of Higher Education Institutions to global SDGs: How do the SDGs impact HEI and vice versa?
- Sustainability at Higher Education Institutions (HEI): How is sustainability integrated into education, research, governance, operation and outreach? What good practice examples and cases can be identified for "whole institution approaches"? How can institutional sustainability strategies be developed and implemented?

CA members are eligible for a reduced fee of 100 EUR, while the fee for regular participants is 150 EUR. Registration details can be found here.

On 27th April. Coordinated by Charles University, this is the first RCE in the Czech Republic.

The meeting gave representatives from 27 organisations including government ministries, universities, schools, environmental education providers, environmental, cultural and educational and humanitarian NGOs and a sustainable business network. Themes of interest to the network include teacher training, outdoor and experiential learning, arts and cultural sustainability, lifestyle change, sustainable food consumption, sustainable tourism and entrepreneurship. The RCE members committed to using methodologies such as social learning, participative approaches and citizen science.

Information and Communication Technology for Sustainability Summer School

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has a central role to play in the transition to a sustainable society. ICT offers a rich set of tools to collect and analyze diverse sources of data to help us develop and share new solutions, and increasingly, ICT provides new low-energy alternatives to physically moving people and goods around the planet.

But at the same time, ICT can seduce us into patterns of overconsumption and waste, as we buy and discard an ever-growing set of gadgets.

The aim of the workshop is to identify a core set of theories and tools from multiple disciplines, representing the things that every student in this field ought to be familiar with.

Lorentz Center meetings dedicate a considerable amount of time to discussion sessions involving both senior and junior scientists, thus stimulating an interactive atmosphere and encouraging collaborations between participants.

There is no registration fee. Approval to attend is at the discretion of the <u>workshop organisers</u>. The scientific committee includes CA member <u>Lorenz Hilty</u>, University of Zurich.

CA Micro Funds support European Virtual Seminar professional development workshop



From 6th to 7th April 2016, the EVS consortium organized a professional development workshop, hosted by the Maastricht University Graduate School of Sustainability Science (ICIS-MUST), in the Netherlands.

EVS (European Virtual Seminar on Sustainable Development, www.ou.nl/evs) is a web-based course, jointly organized and offered by 10 universities from across Europe, including 5 CA members. In EVS, international, multi-disciplinary student teams conduct case studies in European sustainable development, coached by teachers.

In the workshop, EVS teachers from CA and non-CA members jointly reflected on the value of EVS for their professional development. Three major aspects of EVS as a professional opportunity in ESD (Education for Sustainable Development) were identified: EVS as an on-the-job training opportunity, as an international staff mobility opportunity, and as an active learning and innovation community. Particular attention was paid to the development of ESD competences of tutors through participation

in EVS, based on the UNECE (2011) competence framework.

The participants concluded that EVS is an effective opportunity for developing a range of ESD competences, especially for junior university staff. Web-based, internationally networked courses like EVS, with a pedagogical approach and design focused on ESD, have a large potential in providing effective opportunities within university curricula to acquire and practice ESD competences for teaching staff. However, to realize this potential, active uptake of the approach by the existing networks for ESD in higher education is needed.

The Cyprus Institute of Neurology and Genetics (CING) was established in 1990 as a private, bicommunal, non-profit, academic center with the aim of providing research, services and education in the areas of neurology, genetics and biomedical sciences. Cyprus School of Molecular Medicine (CSMM) is a postgraduate school which is a distinct entity within CING.

CSR and Sustainability Committee and Sustainability Plan

The CING/CSMM has committed to form a CSR & Sustainability Committee that will oversee the sustainability initiatives of the organization. It also commits to develop a Sustainability Plan, following consultation with a wide range of the organization's stakeholders. The Plan will recognize that creating a sustainable operating environment will strengthen the organization's three pillars: Research, Education and Services. This is an essential step forward in building a future in which our research and teaching will provide solutions to problems in our organization and beyond, such as: a) water and energy savings in our labs, b) failure to incorporate sustainability principles in our teaching and research, c) failure to educate the society in combating global challenges, such as climate change, resource scarcity and air pollution. The Sustainability Plan will provide guidance on how to embed sustainability in each one of the five significant pillars for the implementation of sustainability in Academic Institutions: Teaching, Research, Operations, Promotion-Outreach to the Community and Culture.

The institutions' interest, hopes and expectations through joining the COPERNICUS Alliance include strengthening of our efforts to educate and practice sustainability through an active learning environment for our students and staff. The CA will open many doors for CSMM, as this is still relatively a new concept in Cyprus and we are keen to be inspired and motivated through all members' activities.
