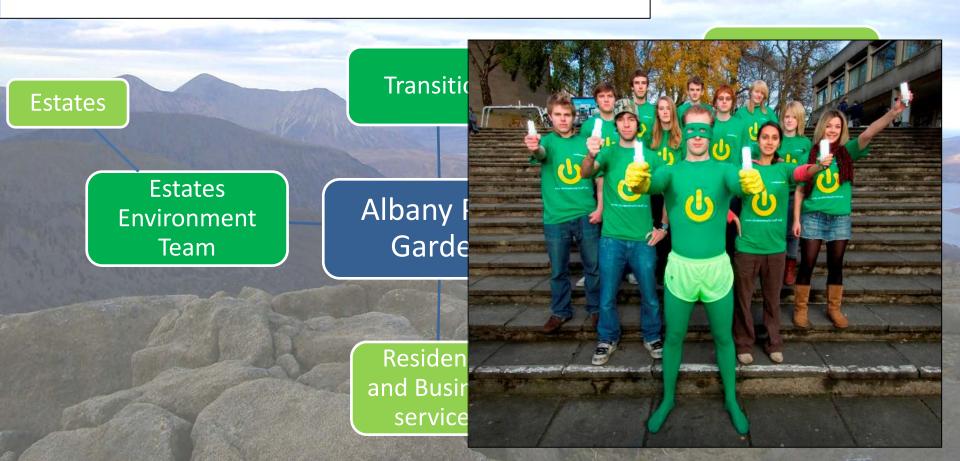

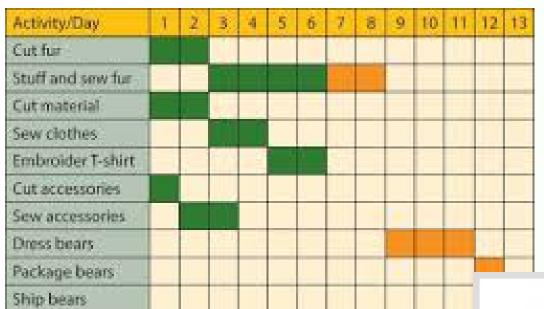

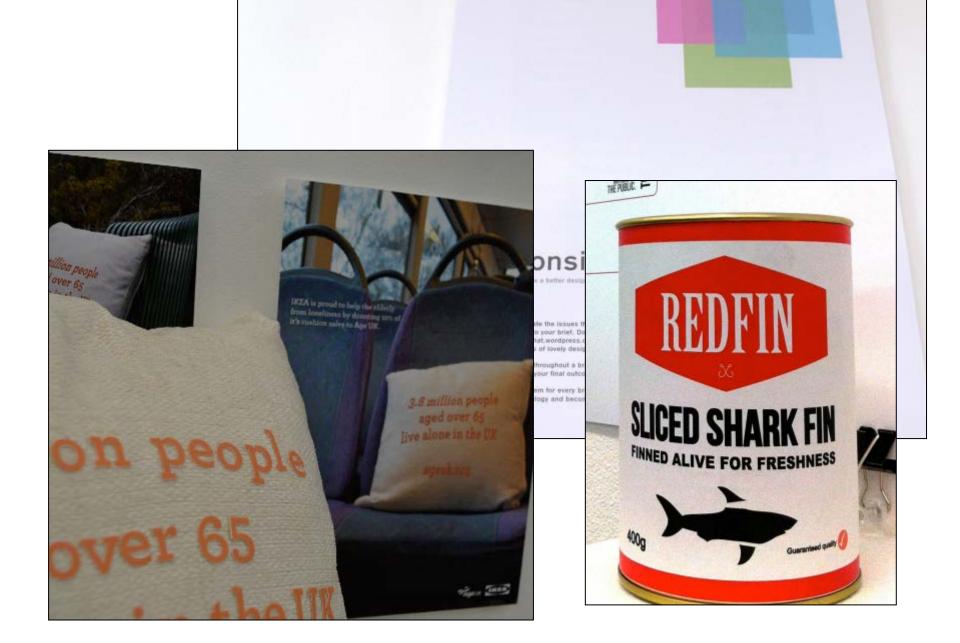

One of our course priorities is to embed more responsible and ethical approaches to the way we work and teach.

To reflect this our 2013 show uses 82% less foam board, 46% less paper, and cut down mount spray use by over 90%. Where appropriate we used — 100% FSC approved recycled paper—and vegetable based inks to print. The show format was designed to be easily transferable and uses lightweight materials to save on fuel and transportation costs.

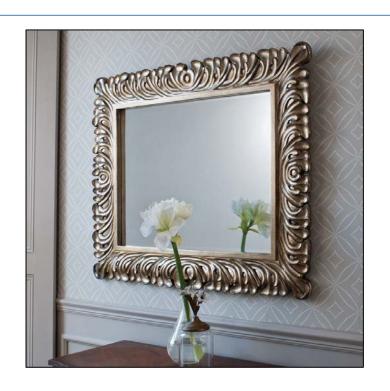

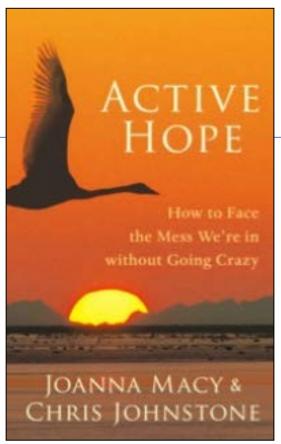
